This Month Cover: Fushimi Inari

Fushimi Inari Taisha is the head shrine of Inari, located in Fushimi-ku, Kyoto, Japan. The shrine sits at the base of a mountain also named Inari which is 233 metres above sea level, and includes trails up the mountain to many smaller shrines which span 4 kilometers and take approximately 2 hours to walk up.

Since early Japan, Inari was seen as the patron of business, and merchants and manufacturers have traditionally worshipped Inari. Each of the torii at Fushimi Inari Taisha is donated by a Japanese business. First and foremost, though, Inari is the god of rice.

Toyota new car sales Show room opened

Toyota's new car show room recently opened in Yangon. Mitsui & Co., Ltd in alliance with Myanmar's official Toyota service shop Mingalar Motors (MGM) held the opening ceremony on November 26. Local officials such as Yangon Region Chief Minister U Myint Swe, along with over 500 other guests attended.

MGM was formed as joint venture between Mitsui & Co, SCG Trading which is the subsidiary of Thailand's major conglomerate Siam Cement Group, and local company Oriental Apex Car Sales & Service (OAC) which handles the new car sales.

Toyota has started discussions to build a manufacturing plant in Myanmar. In ASEAN, Myanmar's auto manufacturing capabilities are extremely low and the government wants to strengthen this area.

JALUX to manage Mandalay airport 3 member consortium signs contract

A Japanese company will operate the first 100% privately invested airport privatization project involving foreign investment. On November 16, the consortium of Mitsui, Yoma Development, and MC-Jalux Airport Services signed the management



transfer contract with the Myanmar Airport Authority to operate Mandalay Airport for a 30 year term. From March 2015, the consortium will manage the renovation and repair of the aging airport terminal building and facilities and will take over most operations except for air traffic control.

In 2013, Mandalay Airport handled 750,000 passengers. It is designed to handle 3 million.

Plans for further investment Nissan Altima sales launch

On November 28, ETCM, the company handling Nissan sales, held a press event at Yangon's Sedona Hotel to launch the sales of Nissan's brands Altima and X-Trail.

Well known as a local Nissan dealership, ETCM is a subsidiary of Tan Chong Motors which has a broad alliance with Nissan Motors in Southeast Asia including Malaysia, Thailand, Vietnam, Laos, Cambodia, and Myanmar to manage showrooms, service centers, and production factories.

ETCM (MM)'s CEO Dato' Cheah Sam Kip is planning to increase market share in Myanmar by selling Nissan's popular car types, and plans to invest more in the future. Altima costs US\$59,000 while X-Trail costs US\$65,000.



Konica Minolta new product launch High end digital printing

On November 27, Konica Minolta's Myanmar distributor Gandamar O.A. & Business Solutions held a new product launch event Yangon's Strand Hotel.

The Managing Director Daw Kyu Kyu gave the opening address at the ceremony and then Executive Director Kyaw Kyaw Soe explained the current features and positioning of Konica Minolta's market leading products.

Leopalace 21 Myanmar branch opening ceremony Blueprint for new business expansion

Leopalace 21 has been aggressively expanding overseas and recently set up local entities in China, Cambodia, and Myanmar.



On December 5, it held the opening ceremony for its Myanmar branch at Yangon's Park Royal Hotel and there were many guests including customers and related parties. The company began operations on August 1.

President Hideo Fukayama made the opening address and shared his vision for business development and company direction. The company has built up knowledge and trust over a long period by handling corporate contracts for over 560,000 rooms across Japan and it provides detail-oriented service to local Japanese companies.

The company plans to provide serviced apartments in Cambodia from 2017 and is considering launching Myanmar service from next year. It plans to continue overseas expansion with a target of 20 sites for 2016.

Panasonic exhibition Promoting its presence in B2B market



On November 18-19, Panasonic Asia Pacific held its first general exhibition in Myanmar "Panasonic Solutions Expo" at Sule Shangri La Hotel. Yangon Region Chief Minister U Myint Swe gave the opening address with government officials in attendance.

The exhibition hall was divided into 6 zones – Corporate Branding, Home, Energy Solutions, Hotels, Education, and Convenience Stores – and the company demonstrated its presence in both B2C and B2B segments

introducing its high quality and leading technology "Made in Japan" products groups and solutions.

Panasonic also plans to link its two service centers in Yangon and Mandalay into the Panasonic General Showroom. Under the slogan "A better life, a better world", it plans to expand its interaction points with customers through after sale service. The company also promoted its worldwide "Solar Lanterns 100,000 Project" as one of its contributions to society. In Myanmar, it has donated over 7,000 units.

Asahi and Loi Hein Tap synergies with local company



On November 11 in Yangon, Asahi Group Holdings and local company Loi Hein held a ceremony for the establishment of a joint venture for carbonated drink production and sales.

The event took place at the Inya Lake Hotel and a stage was set up with images of pagodas, Japanese temples, and Mt Fuji projected on a screen to highlight the bonds between Japan and Myanmar. The CEO of Asahi Group Holdings, Mr. Naoki Izumiya, stated that he wanted to tap the synergies between Loi Hein's distribution network and strong local brand and Asahi's strengths in production, quality control technology, product development knowledge, and marketing.

The ceremony was attended by Myanmar Minister at the President's Office U Soe Thein and Japan Ambassador Mr. Tateshi Higuchi.

Textile & Garment Exhibition Calls for infrastructure better

During November 20-23, the "Myanmar International Textile & Garment Industry Exhibition" was held at the Myanmar Event Park.

Textile and ancillary industry companies exhibiting from Japan included Juki, Fujix, Dukes, and Hashima.

There was a strong feeling that the calm character of Myanmar people is suited for the garment industry and there was a lot of attention on plans of SPA's (specialty store retailer of private apparel) such as Uniqlo to set up in

Myanmar.

However, Mr. Yamanaka from Hashima pointed out "The cost of workers and land is rising and it's an issue whether technology can compensate for this". Also, others commented "It is tough to balance quality and cost factors". While Chinese defective rates are 10%, Myanmar is around 30%. Increasing yields will be a key challenge going forward.

A gap to fill in the market Setting up a Japanese quality dialysis center

On November 9, a ceremony sponsored by Ship Healthcare Holdings Inc was held at Parami General Hospital in Yangon for the introduction of Dialysis Testing Equipment.

Going forward, the company will use Nipro dialysis instruments at the hospital to set up Japanese style water quality management and achieve ISO standard water quality management.

In Myanmar, there are 1200 artificial dialysis patients. There are many suffering from diabetes due to diet, and there are over 100,000 estimated potential patients for dialysis. There are many private hospitals focused on this treatment area.

The Senior Managing Director of Ship Healthcare Holdings Mr. Kobayashi, said "We want to contribute to the treatment of Myanmar people." The company is also considering setting up a School for Clinical Pathology and CT Scan center in the future.

Resona Bank and Apex Bank business alliance Support of SME expansion in ASEAN

On November 24, Resona Holdings signed an MOU for a business alliance with Myanmar Apex Bank to cooperate in providing financial services. Apex will provide financial products and detailed support through its branch network to SMEs with expanding business needs in Myanmar. During the signing ceremony at Sule Shangri La Hotel, the signatory Mr. Kazuhiro Azuma CEO shared his aspirations, "With this partnership, we will share our knowledge to create a win-win relationship which will contribute to the growth of Myanmar."

Apex Bank is owned by the major conglomerate Eden Group and is the 4th largest commercial bank in terms of assets.

Car Market in Myanmar

Popular Brands, Popular Models,

In Myanmar, the automobile (car bus truck, etc) market is becoming more and more active. Generally speaking, the price of automobile (car bus truck, etc) in Myanmar is much higher than in other countries. That first step toward liberalizing the domestic automobile market in 2011 saw the import of more than 100,000 cars, mostly from Japan and South Korea. Then, in 2012, the government announced that anyone with a foreign savings account could import cars. Soon car showrooms were placing more orders for vehicles from Japan.

Japan's Toyota leads in Myanmar auto sales

Leading Japanese vehicle maker Toyota is still dominating Myanmar's growing automobile market with 53 % compared with top Korean and Western automobile brands, according to an online survey released October 13.

Yangon-based Motors.com.mm conducted an online survey from October 6 to 10 based on online trading on its website, the Motors.com.mm.

The five-day survey showed that Toyota brand stands at 53 % in top position, Honda 11 %, Nissan 8 % Hyundai 7 %,

Mitsubishi 6 %, Suzuki and Korea KIA brand and European, US and Chinese brands 3 %, Mazda and Daihatsu 2 % and Lexus, which is a division of Toyota, and Isuzu have 1 % respectively, according to a press release.

Toyota is highly durable, performs well in Myanmar weather conditions, and there are no problems with spare parts. Independent research about the local automobile market conducted by the Singapore-based consultancy firm and

one of the local car showrooms reflects the findings of the Motors.com.mm survey.

Motors.com.mm is currently working with 210 car showroom owners, and individual car importers, and about 95 percent of car brokers in Yangon, Mandalay and Nay Pyi Taw, Mr Woelk said. Currently there are 9,500 vehicles for sale on the website, and since the site was launched in 2012, a total of 20,000 vehicles have been sold, he said.

Future of the Market

All Eyeing on Myanmar

Foreign firms are eagerly eyeing Myanmar as its once-closed market, with the nation of 51 million people suddenly thrust on to the frontline of global consumerism. However, import regulations have been eased by Myanmar as part of the reform process to allow more vehicles to be brought in from overseas - for those who can afford them - while the US last year ended its investment ban.

U Htay Aung

Born in 1951, U Htay Aung received his Master Degree in Tourism from George Washington University in 1991. Since then, he has contributed to the development of the Myanmar tourism industry for many years, and has served as the General Manager and Managing Director of Myanmar Hotels & Tourism Services, Director General of Directorate of Hotels and Tourism, Deputy Minister for Hotels and Tourism. In August 2012, he was appointed to his current position of Minister for Hotels and Tourism.

Myanmar's tourism industry enters the development stage

Nagasugi Today I am pleased to be with the Tourism Minister U Htay Aung, who is spearheading the promotion of Myanmar tourism. I would like to ask you about the current conditions and outlook for the Myanmar travel market. But first, please share with us your views on the hotel room shortage and transportation infrastructure issues. With the increasing number of tourists and business people visiting

Myanmar, many people feel the infrastructure is not sufficient to meet the rising demand.

Aung While it is true our level of infrastructure is not ideal compared to advanced countries, we are making progress to improve the situation.

Do you know how many hotels there were in 2011 at the time Myanmar transitioned to its new system? Only 500 hotels with around 20,000 rooms. Now we have increased to around 1,000 hotels with 40,000 rooms. Famous branded international hotel chains such as Hilton, Accor, Best Western, Kempinski, and Wyndham have come one after the other, opening in major cities, or working towards opening. I expect that we will have plenty of rooms to meet the demand of tourists in the near future.

Service is clearly improving

Nagasugi What do you think of the transportation infrastructure? Do you think a peaceful and picturesque cityscape is possible in the near future?

Aung Overland transportation is improving. With the current relaxing of vehicle import restrictions, there are more new long distance buses being introduced.

Also, high speed expressways, which used to be just a dream, are now being built. Compared to before, people should feel it is much easier to travel.

Additionally, while in the past there were only 3 domestic airlines such as – Myanmar Airways, Yangon Airways, and Air Mandalay – now there are 8. Just look at the development of Myanmar Airways, which is using new equipment to enter international routes.

Nagasugi Certainly it has become easier to access Myanmar from overseas. The changes have been over a very short period of time and things are rapidly evolving.

Aung Improvements in communications infrastructure are also a tailwind for the tourism industry. The communications market used to be monopolized by MPT, but it now has competition between three operators with the introduction of Telenor

Pioneering a frontier tourism market

Travelling in Myanmar... an unknown land shrouded in mystery. It has temples rich with history and beaches and islands with virtually untouched beauty.

There are scenes reminiscent of old Japan. It is a thrilling feeling of travelling across space and time. Myanmar's charms are boundless. However, there are many issues in attracting tourism including poor transport conditions, soaring accommodation prices, and weak communications infrastructure. But these problems are getting resolved with the introduction of Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) systems, international hotel brands, and new communications companies.



Foreign visitors to Myanmar were 2m in 2013, are expected to be 3m in 2014, and will likely exceed 5m in 2015. With Pyu achieving World Heritage Site designation, there is momentum for Bagan and Inle Lake to achieve similar status. Tourism in "Asia's last frontier" is poised for remarkable growth.

and Ooredoo. Even if now you can't see remarkable changes, after 2-3 years you will definitely see dramatic improvements in service – the developments will be phenomenal.

Sharing Myanmar's charm with the world

Nagasugi Myanmar is safe, and has many wonderful tourist spots.

Aung Myanmar is blessed with a diversity of spots including sacred Buddhist sites such as Bagan and Kyauktiyi, scenic lakes such as Inle lake, gorgeous beaches like Ngapali, northern cities like Putao as a base to explore Myanmar's highest peak Hkakabo Razi, and Nat Ma Taung National Park and Indawgyi Lake Wildlife Sanctuary.

Nagasugi With expanding inbound traffic, it's not just the development of hard infrastructure which is important, but also soft infrastructure. What are your thoughts on this?

Aung As you pointed out, Japanese are not receiving enough information on Myanmar tourism. In Japan, train stations have many travel brochures, but in Myanmar such material is limited. I am always thinking how we should develop ways to effectively disseminate such information.

Nagasugi On the point of conveying information to Japanese and Foreigners, I think Myanmar Japon can help with this...

Aung I believe amongst all the information magazines, your magazine level is the highest. I'm interested in your English version. Also, I believe we can learn from the way Japanese hot spring tourism is promoted. When you watch Japanese TV programs on travel information, they don't just introduce the location, but they also include various contents such as food and shopping, and they do a really good job of summarizing the travel experience.

The door to Myanmar has just opened...
"Let the Journey Begin"

Nagasugi Japanese tourist spot promotion does indeed cover the all-round travel experience.

Aung In Myanmar, there are organizations called the Myanmar Tourism Marketing (MTM) and Myanmar Tourism Promotion Board (MTPB) under the Myanmar Tourism Federation, of which I am a member. They need to work together to promote projects. If there are any requests from Japan for Myanmar travel information, please share them with me.

"Think of somebody fondly, distance shrinks"

Nagasugi As Minister of Hotels and Tourism, please describe to our readers the charms of Myanmar tourism.

Aung It's as simple as "Welcome to Myanmar". Myanmar and Japan have cultivated friendly relations over a long period of time. Both countries

have an affinity for each other, and I want to spread information which strengthens the mutual closeness, and deepens the cultural exchanges. The e-Visa system started in September 2014 and should be welcomed by tourists from overseas. We don't just want older people to visit, but a variety of age groups to come. In Myanmar language we have a saying "Think of somebody fondly, distance shrinks". If your feelings for somebody are strong enough, then the distance between you will shrink.

Nagasugi That is a good slogan!

Aung As part of my global activities, I've met many overseas media. I produced a 30 second PR program to promote Myanmar tourism and unveiled it at an international conference. That slogan was "Let the Journey Begin..." For Myanmar which has only recently returned to the international stage, the challenging journey has just begun.

Nagasugi It is expected that 3 million foreign tourists will visit Myanmar in 2014. Many people will be drawn to Myanmar, and I'm sure your tourism industry will continue to develop. Thanks for spending time with us in your busy schedule to share your views.

Popular Festival in Myanmar and Japan Month: January

Kachin Manaw Festival

Date: During January of every year
Location: Myitkyina and Putao of Kachin state

Kachin is a state in northern Myanmar with snow capped mountain and which has a wonderful festival known as Manaw.

Traditional Kachin Manaw Festival is to celebrate the New Year. In ancient times, this festival was to make certain victory in battle. In this festival many Kachins from abroad come back to meet and wear their beautiful traditional costumes and dance at this special event. The traditional poles which are beautifully decorated are placed in the center of the festival ground.



Japanese New Year Festival (Shogatsu)



Japanese New Year celebration is called Shogatsu or Oshogatsu. This is the most important holiday in Japan. Most businesses shut down from January 1 ~ 3, and families typically gather to spend the days together.

People say to each other "akemashite-omedetou-gozaïmasu" (Happy New Year) in the New Year. Japanese people eat special dishes called osechi ryori during shogatsu. They are packed in a Jubako box, which has several layers. Each dish has a particular meaning. For example, prawns for long life, herring roe for fertility, and so on. It is also traditional to eat mochi (rice cake) dishes during New Year's holidays. It is traditional for Japanese people to visit a shrine or a temple during New Year's holidays. People pray for safety, health and good fortune.

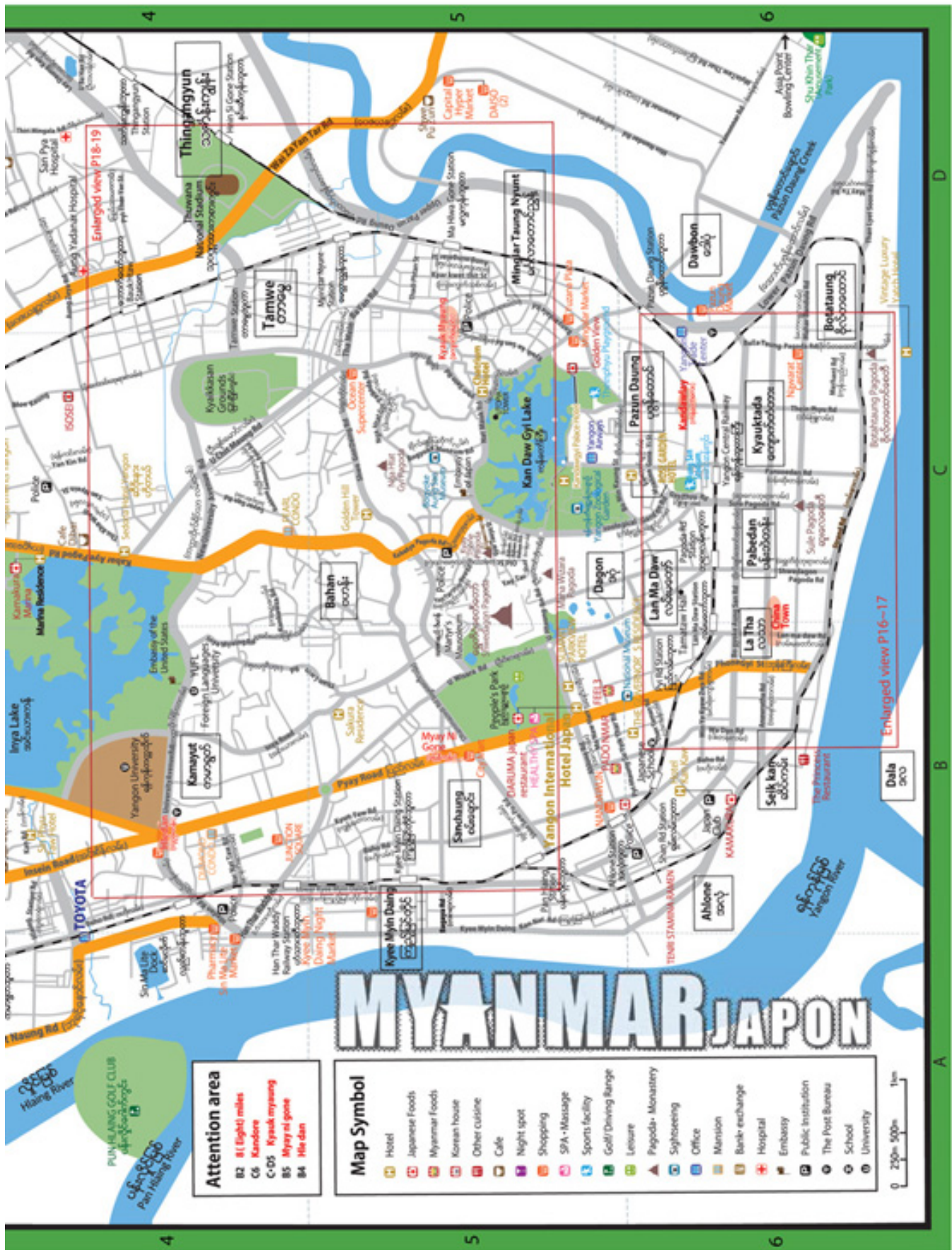

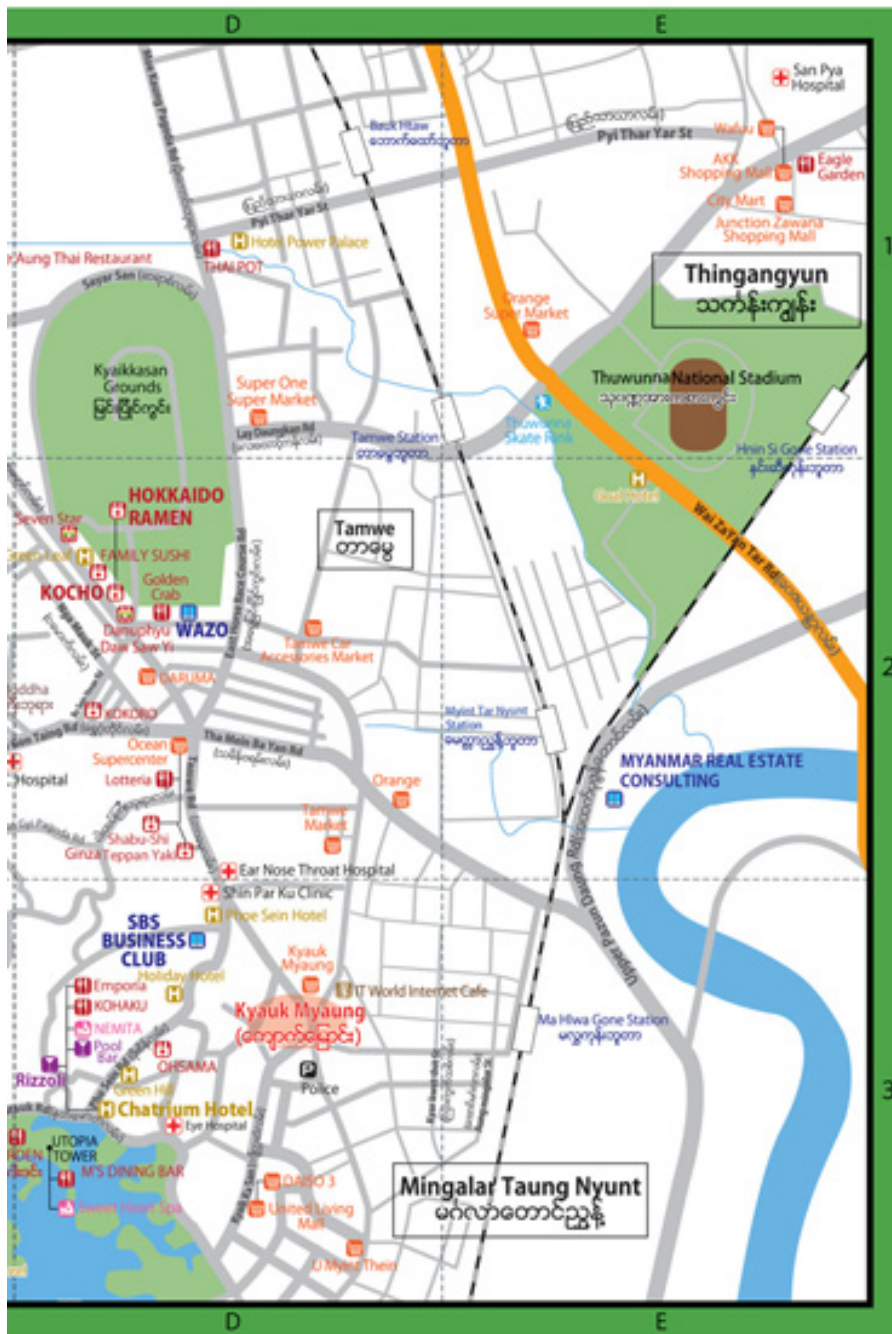

At the time, the site was just a simple farm field which needed to be dug 1 meter deep and equipped with drainage facilities. The funding for the site was from Japanese government aid and donations. It was completed in 1998.



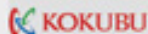
