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#### This Month Cover: Hiraizumi

Hiraizumi is a town located in Nishiwai District, Iwate Prefecture, Japan. Hiraizumi has a number of officially listed National Treasures and other culturally or historically notable sites.

Hiraizumi's most famous attraction, Chusonji was established in 850 as a temple of the Tendai sect of Buddhism. The temple came to prominence when the northern branch of the Fujiwara clan moved their base to Hiraizumi. At its peak, the temple consisted of a large network of dozens of buildings. Luckily, among these is the most spectacular, the Konjikido.

Similar to Kyoto's famous Kinkakuji (Golden Pavilion), Konjikido is a hall completely covered in gold. It stands inside another building for protection. Konjikido, the national treasure building number 1, epitomizes Chuson-ji and Oshu Fujiwara culture. In 2011, Hiraizumi's Cultural Heritage, which includes Chusonji, was registered as a World Heritage Site.

## Strong Japanese corporate investment into Myanmar Top 3 investor within 3 years

Japanese investment into Myanmar is expected to reach top 3 of global investors into Myanmar within 3 years. As of November 2014, Japan's cumulative annual investment was US\$360m ranking 8th amongst investing countries. According to MIC (Myanmar Investment Commission) data, Japanese companies account for the majority of meetings and their investment amount is rising rapidly.

There are over 200 members of the Yangon Japan Chamber of Commerce and Industry. Membership has doubled since the 100 companies registered in May 2013, underlining the Japanese boom into Myanmar.

Japanese investment is focusing on Special Economic Zones and by industry there are many service and construction companies. As of October 2014, there were 50 construction companies and 46 service & logistics companies.

In the summer of 2014 when Myanmar's national census estimated the population at 51 m, far below the previous estimate of 60m, there was concern. But this did not dampen the investing enthusiasm of Japanese companies who pointed out that "GDP per capita is much higher than previously thought" JETRO's Executive Managing Director Mr. Takahara and focused on the huge upside for development.

## Yangon Stock Exchange to launch in fall 2015

### Daiwa Institute of Research sets up management company

The Yangon Stock Exchange is expected to open in the fall of 2015. On December 23, the Myanma Economic Bank under the Ministry of Finance, the Japan Exchange Group, and the Daiwa Institute of Research held a signing ceremony in Naypyidaw for a joint venture agreement. According to onsite reports, the Minister of Finance Win Shein shared his hopes for the stock exchange: "We are opening the path to providing capital for companies, and this will stimulate Myanmar's economy". He also clarified that the licensing process of securities companies would be made public.

In spring 2012, the Japan Exchange Group's predecessor Tokyo Stock Exchange and Daiwa Institute of

Research signed a memorandum with the Myanmar central bank to set up a Myanmar stock exchange and to support the development of local capital markets. With the stock exchange law signed in the summer of 2013 and the government's stock exchange regulator established in August 2014, an environment supportive of capital markets is evolving. Daiwa Securities Group is now developing candidates for listing with 5 initial listing prospects including a bank and a rice distributor.



## Fuji Xerox Digital Printing Seminar

On December 18, Fuji Xerox, a top global printing company, held a digital printing seminar at Yangon's Sule Shangri-la Hotel, in Myanmar.

The seminar was hosted by Fuji Xerox Asia Pacific Pte., Ltd. Myanmar Branch and Concordia International Co., Ltd. Before the seminar, spokespersons from Fuji Xerox's Myanmar branch held a media conference answering the various question from local media.

At the seminar Fuji Xerox Asia Pacific Pte., Ltd. Myanmar Branch's General Manger, Mr. Hideaki gave an opening speech and explained about the establishment of Fuji Xerox. U Myat Ko Oo Sale Manger of Concordia International Co., Ltd. also gave a welcome speech.

Then Mr. Timothy Howard, Senior Manager of Fuji Xerox Asia Pacific Co.,Ltd. presented the topic of "Exploring Digital, Understanding the importance of Digital to Your Business" and Mr.Somaruo, Regional Marketing Advisor of Fuji Film Myanmar Limited, explained about Fuji Film products.

Fuji Xerox started business in Myanmar in 2004 with Concordia International Co, Ltd and established its own Myanmar Branch in 2013. It has also opened branches in Yangon, Mandalay and Naypyitaw.



### Authorized dealer of major interior designer Sangetsu opens showroom in Yangon

On December 1, major interior designer Sangetsu's authorized dealer Trendy Myanmar opened a showroom in Yangon themed on interior design. Three floors of space displayed Sangetsu products such as floor carpets, wallpaper, curtains, Kikusui branded paint and coating materials, and axona AICHI office furniture. Orders could also be made. Delivery time is 2 weeks from order.

Trendy Myanmar is also planning to display household furniture at the end of April.



### MPT introduces new low cost service Swe Thahar

On January 12, the national telecommunication operator, Myanmar Post and Telecommunication (MPT) launched a new service plan called Swe Thahar, giving customers better rates for voice call/SMS and faster internet speed.

The new cost is Kyat 35 per minutes, Kyat 15 per SMS and Kyat 15 per MB for the internet for service subscribers. Moreover, users will be charged Kyat 25 per minute within a specified time to three assigned phone numbers. The subscriber who wants to register for the new plan has to send "SWE" by SMS to number 1332.

"Our customers have been waiting for us to announce new tariffs. Now,

we are very confident about our network and services and therefore, we want to share with you our new offers, as well as the next steps of our development towards connecting Myanmar people", said Mr Takashi Nagashima, CEO of MPT-KDDI-Sumitomo Joint Operations, during the press conference presenting new offers on Friday January 9, at Yangon's PARKROYAL Hotel.

MPT plans to spread the network to reach 70% of the country at the end of 2016 and it will sell more than a million SIM cards. While MPT is still more expensive than other carrier, it is becoming more competitive.



### Project to improve Myanmar's water environment management and environmental impact assessment system

On December 23, Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) signed an agreement with Myanmar's Ministry of Environmental Conservation and Forestry for a "Project to improve Myanmar's water environment management and environmental impact assessment systems". Over 3 years, specialists will be sent to Yangon and Mandalay Development Committees (under the Mayor's office) to train on technology and donate necessary equipment to measure water quality. The goal is to improve the basic capacities and strategies to deal with water contamination and to promote efforts to solve the environmental impact problems that arise with development.

The Myanmar government has prioritized environmental conservation in its national development plans. In 2012, it established the Environmental Conservation Law to protect against environmental pollution arising from industrialization and urbanization. In addition, the Ministry of Environmental Conservation and Forestry reorganized and set up the Environmental Conservation Department to strengthen environmental management. However, the Department is having difficulty preparing detailed rules and guidelines due to shortages of manpower and budget. Another

issue is how to handle Environmental Impact Assessment studies for private sector funded factories and various donor-funded infrastructure projects such as road, electricity, water, and port. There is a need to quickly establish a concrete evaluation procedure and educate and guide business on the importance of such procedures.

With JICA assistance through this project to strengthen Myanmar's capabilities in environmental management and environmental impact assessment, the Myanmar government will be able to achieve its dual goals of environmental protection and national development.

### Investment Approval Awards Ceremony at Thilawa Special Economic Zone

On December 12, an Investment Approval Awards Ceremony was held at Thilawa Special Economic Zone (SEZ) for the first group of investment licenses granted on November 25 for investment at Thilawa SEZ, a public-private joint project being developed by the Japanese and Myanmar governments.

The ceremony was attended by Myanmar Vice President Nyan Tun, Yangon Chief Minister Myint Swe, the Yangon mayor, and various related government vice ministers. In addition, the Japanese Ambassador Mr. Higuchi and MJ Thilawa Development President Mr. YANAI along with representatives from various Thilawa SEZ investors were at the ceremony.

Thilawa SEZ (Zone A) aims to overcome obstacles to foreign investment such as electricity supply, water system, and other infrastructure by developing a high quality economic zone. The project enhances socio-economic development through promoting manufacturing and employment and JICA's contributions have been significant. At the ceremony, Thilawa SEZ Chairman Set Aung commented "Without the cooperation of JICA, it would have been difficult to handle the investment licensing. I'm deeply grateful for their support".





# Boosting Myanmar Export to Japan

## Mangoes, Flowers, Honey and Shrimp – Lead the way exports

Myanmar is known as the richest country in Asia for agricultural and natural resources. But its exports are still small and dominated by oil & gas and timber. The country has yet to realize its agricultural potential. Japan is a significant market for Myanmar along with China, India, South Korea, Germany, Indonesia, and Hong Kong. There is huge potential for Myanmar products in the Japanese market, but the key is to find the right products to export to Japan which can compete with other country exports and meet high Japanese quality standards. This article looks at some potential winners from Myanmar.

### Mango Puree

A creamy tasty version of mangoes

Mango puree is a good product to export to Japan and has strong demand from the food industry for ice cream, bakery and jam. Exporting mango puree is easier than fresh mango as it is processed. Some of Myanmar's exporters are planning to export mango puree produced from Sein Ta Lone mangoes (Diamond Solitaire mangoes) to Japan starting from 2015. Myanmar mango puree was also exported to the EU since 2013 through Ukraine, but has currently stopped because of the military situation in Ukraine.

### Chrysanthemum( Gandamar )

A garden flower, it is now produced commercially on a large scale

Gandamar (Chrysanthemum) is also a promising item to export Japan as it is used in memorial ceremonies.



Myanmar Golden Produce Co., Ltd exported some Gandamar flowers to Japan in 2012 but had some problems with insects. Although this was not a big hurdle, the company still lacks strong demand and regular orders.

Myanmar Golden Produce Co.,Ltd has been selling Sein Ta Lone fresh mangoes (Diamond Solitaire mangoes) and dried mangoes to Japan since 2013. Japanese appreciate the good taste of Sein Ta Lone. Sein Ta Lone has bright yellow flesh with honeyed sweetness and low acidity. Although Myanmar can provide a stable supply of fresh mangoes to the Japanese market there are hurdles to overcome concerning agriculture standards.

### Business Person's Perspective

"All we need is technology and knowledge; we don't need the easing of Japan's standards. If our farmers have enough technology and knowledge we can fulfill the Japanese standard." "There is no problem with our workers using Japanese technology and knowledge once they trained by technicians"

Other country has a strong group of each industries and the group make a good data of products."

## Honey

A major task to modernize of Myanmar



Japan is major buyer of Myanmar's honey with 50 % of Myanmar's honey production exported to Japan according to the beekeepers and exporters. Myanmar Honey Farms Co., Ltd, Smile Happy Co.,Ltd and Green Star Int'l Enterprise Pte Ltd are Myanmar's leading honey exporters exporting to Japan, Europe, USA, Canada, Thailand, Singapore, Vietnam and South Korea.

Myanmar Honey Farms Co., Ltd specializes in beekeeping, supplying beekeeping materials and medicines and sharing apiculture in Myanmar. The honey industry has been growing solidly year by year in the world with rising demand from several markets such as Japan, EU, USA, and China. The company plans to build a honey bottling plant to produce bottled honey rather than bulk honey so as to make more profit margins. It also wants to boost Myanmar honey output by investing in apiculture development. Smile Happy Co.,Ltd is also a one of the leading companies in honey export and produced more than 3000 metric tons of honey in fiscal year 2013-2014. In Nay Pyi Taw there are 1200 beekeepers and other bee fields are located in Shan region, Bago region, Sagaing region.

Shrimp and prawns are making an increasingly significant contribution to the export earnings of Myanmar. According to DOF (Department of Fisheries) statistics major markets for "shrimp" and "prawns" are China, Singapore, Japan, and United States. EU also imports prawns from Myanmar. In the first four months of 2014, Myanmar was in the top 10 supplier list of shrimp to Japan.

Through April 2014, Myanmar shrimp exports to Japan rose 6.0 percent in value and 1.6 percent in volume, according to statistics released by the International Trade Center. For tiger shrimp exporting to Japan, Myanmar has some problem due to low production of tiger shrimp. Myanmar shrimp exporters to Japan still face some barriers because of problems with antibiotics and banned chemicals.

## Building an environment to attract investment

Focus on high value - added joint venture

While Myanmar is keen to export to Japan, there are multiple challenges to expanding such exports. JETRO's (Japan External Trade Organization) Executive Managing Director Mr. Takahara points out that with many Japanese companies coming to Myanmar, imports from Japan are rapidly increasing, but exports to Japan are relatively sluggish. In 2013, while Japanese imports to Myanmar rose to US\$1.3 billion, Myanmar exports to Japan rose only to US\$500 million.



According to a Japanese trading company veteran, "There are no statistics on product quality and quantity so we can't explain the good points of Myanmar products to our customers". In addition, low trading volumes and unstable supplies are bottlenecks.

While Myanmar is known for the high quality of its Arabica coffee, Japanese traders complain that "Compared to Vietnam, the production volumes are low." Regarding shrimp, Myanmar's shrimp farming business was devastated by Cyclone Nargis and nowadays most of the shrimp supply is wild catch, not aquaculture. Wild catch seafood depends on weather conditions creating a risk for Japanese importers seeking stable supply.

Myanmar's production volumes are expected to gradually increase. But the Myanmar government does not have Industry Development Plans for individual products. This causes uncertainty for Japanese business, "We don't have information indicating what sectors will grow, so we don't know where to focus our investment." This is one of the reasons why Japanese companies hold back from investing. Japan's Ministry of Economy, Trade, and Industry is addressing this issue by helping the Myanmar government formulate Industry Development Plans for each industry. They will send draft plans to the Myanmar government in March.

Japanese consumers are very concerned with product quality & safety so Japanese companies demand that food products from overseas meet very high standards. There are cases of Myanmar sesame imports being held up in Japanese quarantine. To address food hygiene issues, JETRO is helping Myanmar develop food product hygiene standards. As part of this cooperation, the industry body "Myanmar Agro-based Food Processor & Exporters Association" is developing its own food product hygiene standards. It is expected this will become the government's standard in the future.

JETRO's Executive Managing Director believes that joint ventures are the best form of cooperation with Japan. If Japan's advanced technology can be adapted to Myanmar's industry, then the export of high quality products will become possible. Major trading house Mitsui & Co has set up a rice milling venture with Myanmar partners and is seeking to export rice to Japan and other countries. To encourage such joint ventures, it is necessary for Myanmar to develop a supportive investment environment.

Dr. Lwin Lwin Soe joined Rangoon University in September 1981 as Tutor, English Department and was promoted as Assistant Lecturer at Yangon University in November 1992 and she taught English to university students. She worked at Yangon University of Distance Education from March 1993 to May 1995 and then at Dawei University until September 1996. Then she was transferred to Yangon University. She worked there for eleven years and was promoted as Lecturer, Associate Professor and Professor/Head respectively.

Dr. Lwin Lwin Soe got a Master of Arts (English) and Ph.D. (English) from Yangon University in 1994 and in 2006 respectively. She served as Acting Rector of Yangon Institute of Education from 2007 to 2011. Then she was appointed as Acting Rector of Yangon University of Foreign Languages and Secretary General of Myanmar National Commission for UNESCO in April 2011. She was promoted as Rector of Yangon University of Foreign Language in July 2012.

### Japanese 2nd most popular next to English

**Nagasugi** Nowadays, YUFL is a University which students can rely on and which gives them good opportunities. We at Myanmar Japon would like to introduce YUFL to the world. Could you please explain more about it?

**Soe** Yangon University of Foreign Languages (YUFL) was established in 1964 at its current location as the

Institute of Foreign Languages (IFL). In 1996, it was upgraded to University level, and named YUFL. There are two Universities of Foreign Languages in Myanmar: the Yangon University of Foreign Language (YUFL) is located in Yangon and the Mandalay University of Foreign Languages (MUFL) in Mandalay in upper Myanmar.

**Nagasugi** Currently, how many subjects are taught at YUFL?

**Soe** At YUFL, Chinese, Japanese, Korean and Thai languages are taught as Oriental Languages and for Western Languages English, French, German and Russian are taught.

**Nagasugi** How many students are attending English classes?

**Soe** We accept 100 new students every year for first years, so there will be more than 1,100 students including the students in the evening classes.

**Nagasugi** How many students are attending Japanese classes?

**Soe** We accept 100 new students for the Japanese classes each year. However, some students have left for Japan to study; with only about 300 students remaining from the first year to fourth year. The morning session from 7:00 am to 8:30 am is for the 4-year Part-Time Diploma courses, and there are about 200 students. The evening classes are offered under the Human Resource Development programme and about 300 students are attending. So in total, about 800 students are studying Japanese.

**Nagasugi** So Japanese language has the second highest attendance?

**Soe** Yes, previously, Chinese had the second highest attendance. Now,

Japanese is becoming popular and has the second highest attendance.

**Nagasugi** What is the third highest attendance and how many students does it have?

**Soe** Chinese has the third highest attendance with approximately 600 students.

**Nagasugi** How many total students are there for all languages?

**Soe** There are 3,300 students in YUFL's regular language programmes and over 2,000 students are in the morning and evening Diploma classes. So, there are over 5,300 students studying as a total.

**Nagasugi** We know that there are many Myanmar students coming to study at YUFL every year, but are there any Japanese students studying Myanmar language among the 5,300 students?

**Soe** Yes, the Center of Excellence for Teaching Myanmar as a Foreign Language has been opened and is providing Myanmar Language programmes for foreign students from several countries including Japan. A total of 252 new students have been admitted and 78 students are continuing their studies.

### Practice for business

**Nagasugi** Could you please explain why Japanese is becoming popular?

**Soe** There are more and more people who want to learn Japanese language. Nowadays, there are a large number of job opportunities that require Japanese language skills due to many Japanese companies opening, and many Myanmar youths are

#### Two specialized universities for the study of foreign languages in Myanmar

The University of Foreign Languages, Yangon, located in Yangon, is the leading university for the study of foreign languages in Myanmar. The university offers full-time four-year bachelor's degree programs, and part-time diploma programs in the study of several Asian and European languages. In upper Myanmar, Mandalay University of Foreign Languages is located in Mandalay city.

YUFL was founded as the Institute of Foreign Languages (IFL) in January 1964, offering courses in French, German, Japanese and Russian language studies. IFL added Chinese speaking courses in 1965, English courses in 1969, and Burmese for foreigners in 1974. It was renamed to its current name in 1996. The university also offers Myanmar language courses for international students.

interested to work with Japanese. Therefore, apart from regular classes, there are more students joining part time Diploma classes and evening classes, too. In addition to more job opportunities, there are other attractions such as outstanding students can pursue further studies in Japan.

**Nagasugi** As a business person involved in recruitment, I observe that even though there is high demand for workers, there are not enough skilled workers in Myanmar with Japanese language ability for Japanese companies. Could you please explain how YUFL is planning to fill up this gap?

**Soe** Yes, YUFL has signed MoUs with Soka University, Josai University, and Aeon 1% Club Foundation and signed an MoA with Japan foundation. The International University of Health and Welfare, Japan, has also offered to provide full scholarships for YUFL graduates. They will welcome our outstanding students for 4 years Medical study in Japan. Also 100% of YUFL Japanese graduates get the Jobs offered by Japanese companies and YUFL is proud of that.

**Nagasugi** Yes, apart from the Japanese language, does YUFL teach Japanese cultural traditions, occupational terms, and business manners?

**Soe** In Regular classes and Diploma classes, the modules of Japanese Culture, Japan's history, Traditions, and literature are included. We plan to provide Business Manner, Occupational Terms, DO's and DON'Ts and workplace training.

**Nagasugi** I would like to volunteer my experiences and knowledge regarding applied Business knowledge, DO's and DON'Ts for business as I have been working since I was 21 years old in

Japan and America.

**Soe** We plan to offer Business Knowledge training programme in 2015, and greatly appreciate your offer and look forward to working with you.

### Partners support, Active interchange

**Nagasugi** Various difficulties arise due to more Students wanting to attend the classes in YUFL. What is the biggest

challenge for you?

**Soe** The biggest challenge is finding teachers. Now, the Japan Foundation is assisting to find Native Speaker teachers. The Japanese department was established with Native Speaker teachers and Daw Si Si Shein who graduated with a BA from Japan served as the first local Head of the department. Now there are a total of 26 teachers including 1 native speaker teacher in the Japanese Department but we still need more teachers. Therefore, we are providing a Teacher Training Programme for Japanese Graduates and signed an MoU for having PhD teachers from foreign Universities. The doctoral programme will be offered when Doctorate teachers come and teach in Department.

**Nagasugi** More students means more teaching material requirements, Could you please tell us what is required?

**Soe** The Language Laboratory donated by Sony Company in 1974 was damaged during Cyclone Nagis. Sony Company donated another Laboratory and upgraded it in 2012. Even though there are 6 Language Laboratories, only 4 are in good condition. The Laboratories are used

not only by Japanese language students but also other students at the University. While the Laboratories may meet standards for Myanmar, they need to be updated to international level quality. We would like to ensure that students have good teaching aids and facilities.

**Nagasugi** What are the other requirements?

**Soe** During my visit to Japan last November I found that the Japanese students have modern education systems and they are using up-to-date educational equipment. We can learn from the education system in Japan and I would be happy if our students can have grants for scholarship or any facilities. Recently there is more assistance, for example, 20 students were awarded scholarships of \$200 per person by Aeon 1% Club foundation for the first year; the out-standing students among those will be awarded \$ 300 in the next year and it will be increased from \$ 4,000 to \$ 9,000 and \$ 15,000 later on. This kind of scholarship programme is one of the reasons for increasing numbers of students learning Japanese. Another reason is the good job opportunities.

**Nagasugi** Does YUFL have any plans to have MoUs with other Universities apart from 2 Japanese Universities?

**Soe** Yes, we have. We are going to sign a MoU with Meio University in March 2015. We agreed with Japan College of Foreign Languages for further study of YUFL's students there during my study tour of Japanese Universities and Schools arranged by JICA.

He is President of Yangon Wakyo Kai, Vice President of the Japan Myanmar Friendship Association, and Special Committee Member of the Japan New Business Council Association.

# Let's ride the circular train!



**Travel like a Yangonite! Ride the circular... Look for the Japanese carriages!**

Yangon's circular line will remind you of Tokyo's Yamanote-line or Osaka's Loop-line. As a means of transport connecting the heart of Yangon with its outskirts, the circular line provides an ideal glimpse into the life of regular Yangonites. One round takes approximately 3 hours. Sit next to the window and enjoy the train's gentle rocking and fascinating scenery.

The platform has a lively market.

The station stands out against the countryside scenery.

People enjoy sports on the platform. There is a shopping street in front of the station.

The henna colored station building dominates the scenery. There is a rail yard with Japanese trains you can see from the window.

There is a market up to the platform. Shops selling vegetables and fish surround the station.

**The** Yangon circular line connects 38 stations across 47 kilometers. It runs at a leisurely 15 kph and one loop takes just under 3 hours.

The trains and stations are very dilapidated, but recently the service has become more popular with the introduction of used air conditioned trains from Japan. With the worsening traffic situation in Yangon, many Yangonites are starting to consider the service as an effective means of transport.

You can buy tickets at the station ticket booth. Regular carriages are Kyat 200 while air conditioned is Kyat 300. The ticket booth provides an approximate schedule. During morning rush hour, several trains leave every hour, but depending on the time of day and station you may need to wait over 1 hour. Not all trains do a full loop and many stop halfway at Insein station. If you want a full loop, make sure you check at the ticket booth.

Inside the train, you can experience the daily life of Myanmar people with vendors shouting and mothers breastfeeding.

Going north, you'll pass through farm-land with idyllic scenery. If you have time, it's fun to get off and explore from a station you like. If you get tired, no worries, it is easy to return by taxi.

**Japanese aid supports train modernization – introduction of "Kiha" train carriages**

Japan has a deep connection with the Yangon circular railway. Since 2013, used "Kiha 38" carriages, which ran the Kurumi Line before in Japan, have been brought for use on the circular line. You can still see Japanese signs inside the train.

In response to the Myanmar government's plan to use the railway to mitigate worsening traffic jams, the Japanese government is providing aid to modernize the circular line. Experts are developing improvement plans. There is cooperation on many fronts including enhancing the signal system. Myanmar Railways has also announced that as part of their circular line modernization plans, they intend to introduce Japanese electric trains.

Month: February

### Htamene Festival (Harvest Festival)

Date: During February  
(Full Moon Day of Tabodwe)  
Location: Country wide

In Myanmar, February is the 11th month of Myanmar's lunar calendar and it's also called Tabodwe. Tabodwe, which is the season when farmers begins their harvest. It's time for seasonal festival and seasonal festival and making of Htamene, a concoction of glutinous rice, coconut slices, sesame seeds, peanuts and a generous amount of cooking oil. This festival is celebrated all through country-wide on the full moon day of Tabodwe. After the Htamene is made it is taken to the pagodas and monasteries to be offered to the Buddha images and to the Sanghas. The rest is divided and shared among those who contributed volunteers, neighbors and friends in the community. Working as a group and sharing food together is a proud custom of the Myanmar people.



### Setsubun (Bean-Throwing Festival)

Date: Date: 3 February 2015  
Location: Country wide



Setsubun festival is held on February 3 or 4, one day before the start of spring according to the Japanese lunar calendar. The festival is celebrated differently depending on the region, but usually includes throwing beans around to keep ogres and evil spirits out of one's home, as it is said that ogres dislike beans. In present days, setsubun involves the throwing of roasted beans around one's house and at temples and shrines across the country. When throwing the beans, you are supposed to shout "Oni wa soto! Fuku wa uchi!" ("Devils out, happiness in"). After that you should pick up and eat the number of beans, which corresponds to your age.

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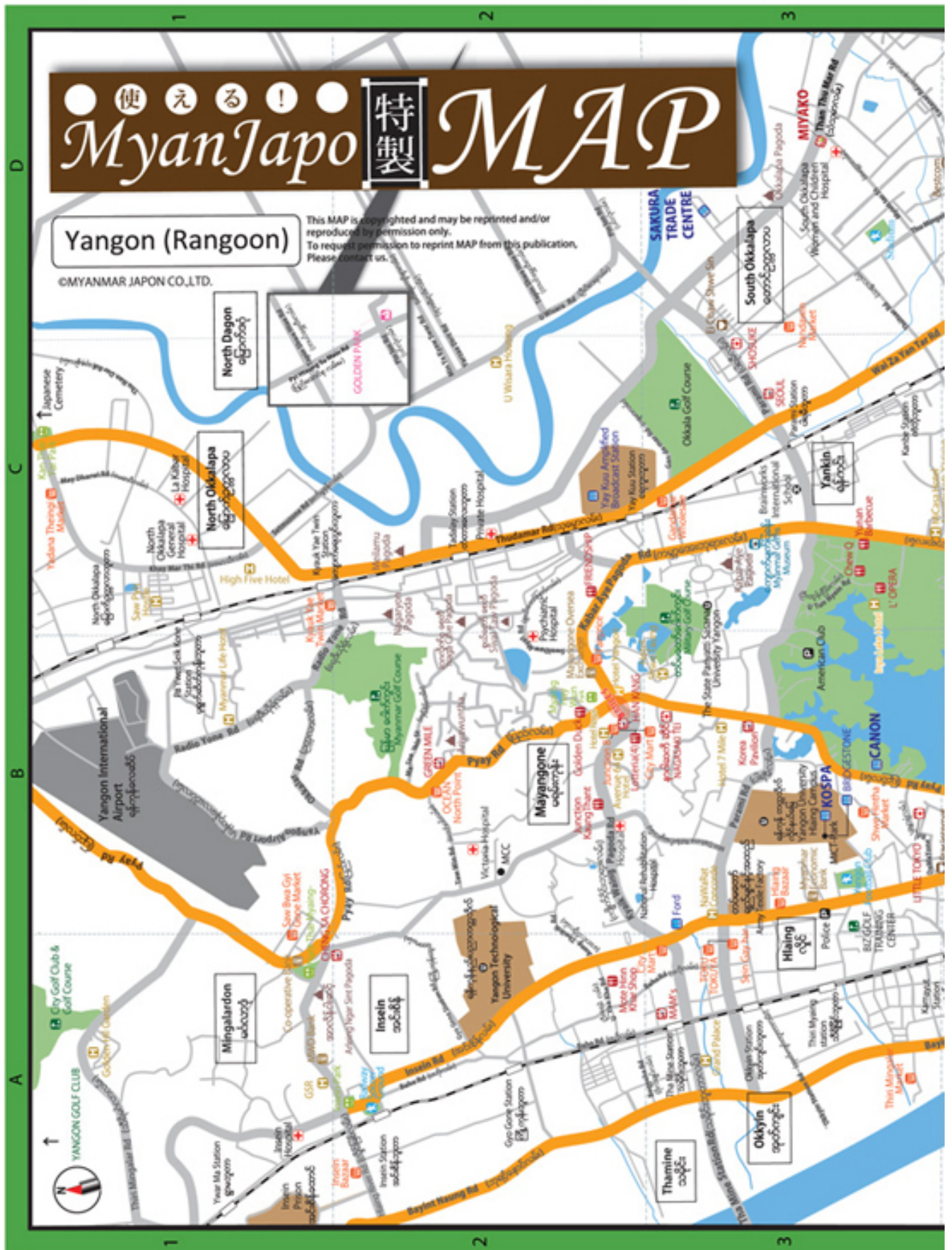
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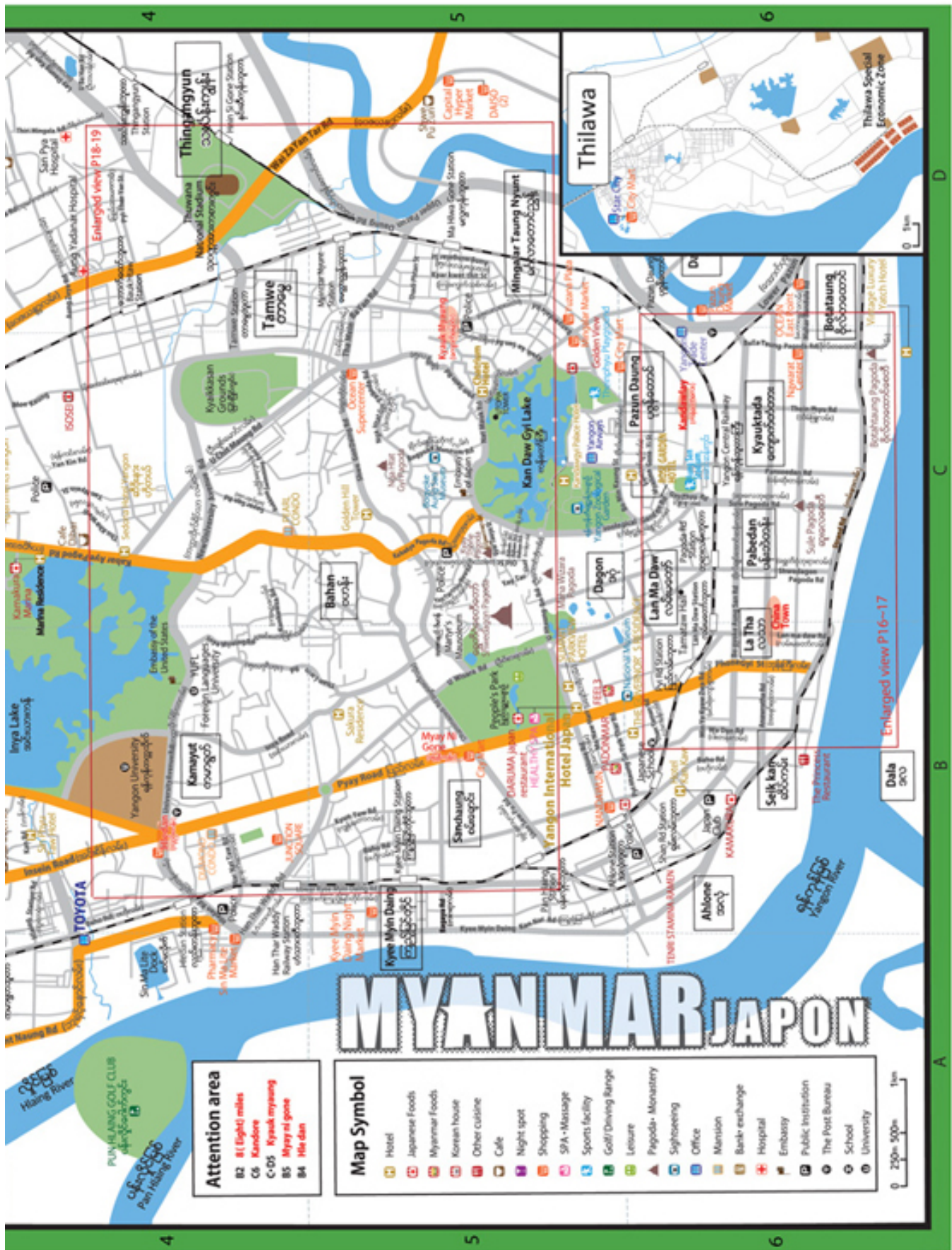

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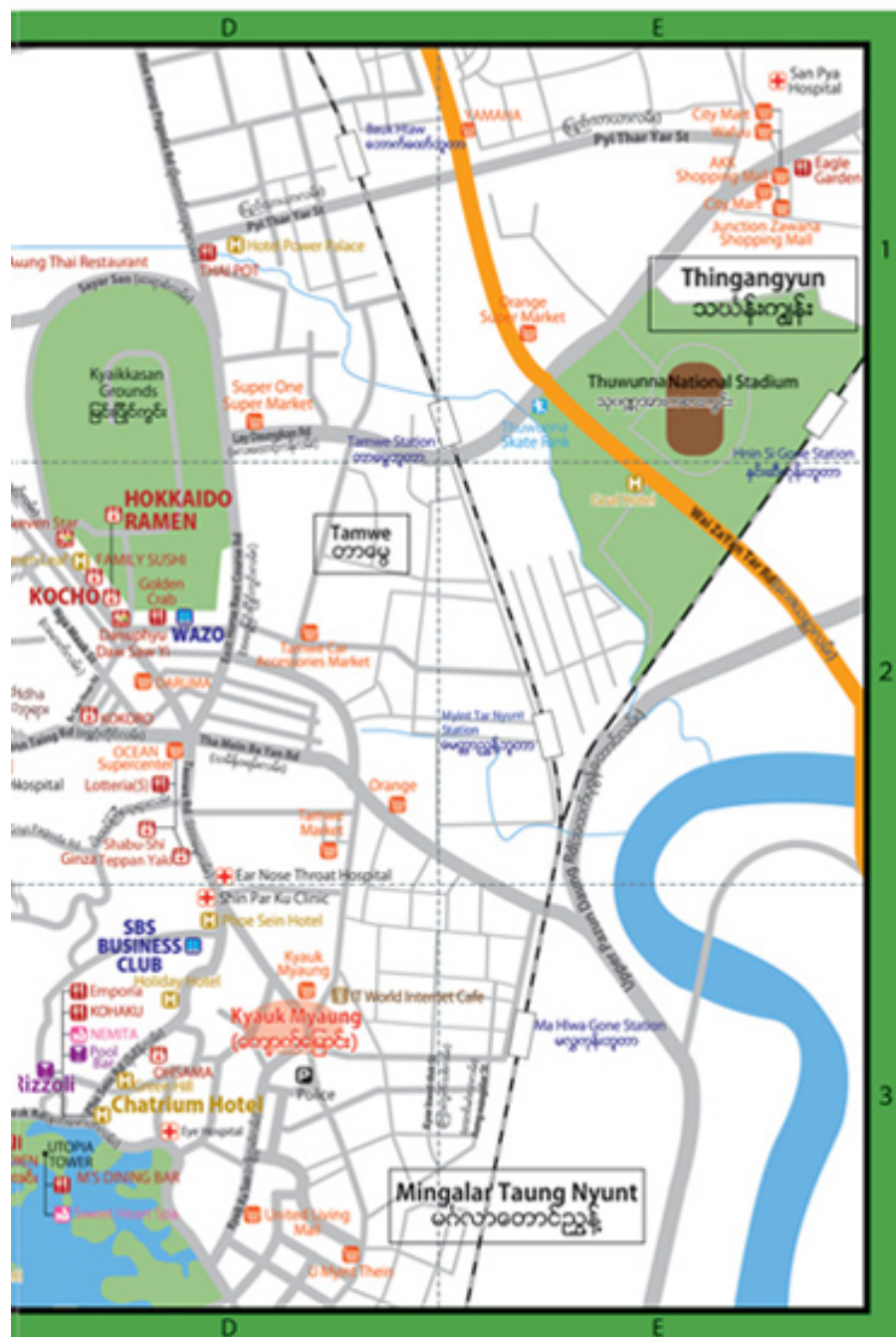
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## Asia - connected by traditional musical instruments "One Asia" concert
